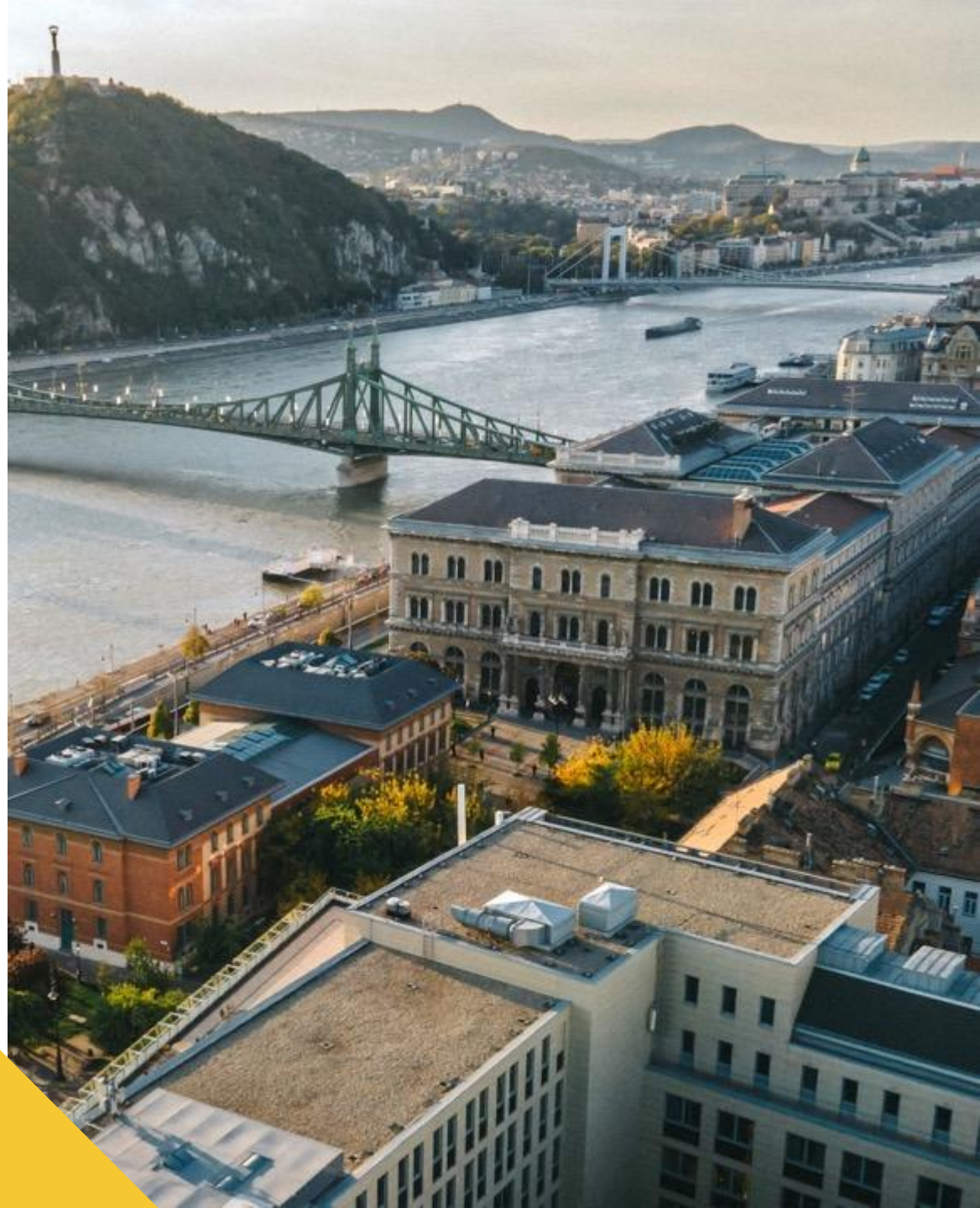
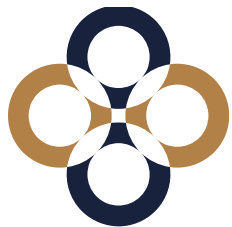

(direct to the university)

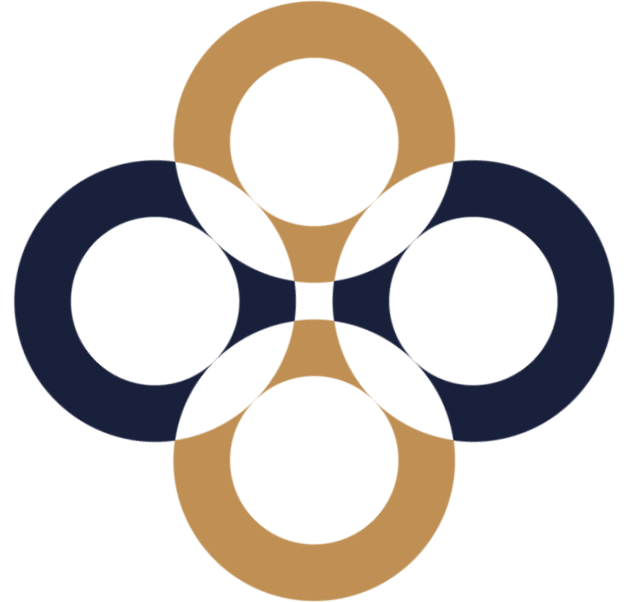
Corvinus numbers
